



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This webinar will focus on the assessment of children's advocacy centers as trauma-informed providers of care to children and youth experiencing trauma. We will review the use of the National Child Traumatic Stress Network (NCTSN) Trauma-Informed Organizational Assessment (TIOA) tool to assess a children's advocacy center (CAC) and rely on the lessons learned during a beta use of the assessment to discuss how changes in a CAC can improve staff skills and services provided to children and youth that have experienced trauma.


















Clinical Services - 2019

- 139 children engaged in TF-CBT treatment
 - 72% female
 - 73% African American
- 1,342 therapy sessions completed
- Problematic Sexual Behaviors ages 7-12
- 30 foster parents trained in trauma-informed parenting
- 100 therapists trained in TF-CBT
- 12 Envision events for CSEC youth
